1. Purpose. To establish policy and guidelines regarding the free exercise of religion for authorized Naval Training Center NTC personnel and dependents.

2. Cancellation. NTCGLAKESINST 1730.1A. This instruction has been substantially revised and should be reviewed in its entirety.

3. Background. References (a) through (e) establish policies and procedures for the free exercise of religion in the Navy. Reference (f) sets forth free exercise policies for all commands under the Chief of Naval Education and Training (CNET). It is the intention of Commander, Naval Training Center (CNTC) to provide the most effective Command Religious Program (CRP) that budgets and manpower will permit. References (g) and (h) establish policies and procedures for administering a Religious Offering Fund (ROF). Reference (i) establishes policies and procedures for the use of CRP facilities.

4. Policy. The CNTC will ensure that all personnel have the opportunity to freely exercise and observe their religious beliefs as specified in the references. Commander, Naval Training Center's CRP is an essential part of the command. It shall be managed and supported as an integral element of the total program which carries out the CNTC mission.

5. Responsibilities. The Director, Chaplain Department is responsible to CNTC for the administration and management of the CRP. The references will be used as procedural guidelines for the administration of the CRP.

6. Organization.

a. Under reference (j), the Chaplain Department is organized into three divisions: Recruit Training Command Division, Service School Command Division, and Naval Training Center Division under the Director, Chaplain Department. Each Division Officer is responsible to the Director for the administration of the CRP within the division. Division Chaplains are responsible for following the guidelines established by the references.

b. Commanding Officers of component and tenant commands shall incorporate the chaplains as an integral part of their command organizations. They shall provide space and logistic support to carry out the CRP.

c. The Chaplain Department Director shall, in consultation with component and tenant Commanding Officers, assign department personnel to fulfill the CNTC mission to assure free exercise of religion for all.

7. Reports. Active Duty Chaplain's Semi-Annual Report (CNET 1730/4) is to be submitted to CNET (Code 007) via CNTC. The report is due to CNET (Code 007) on 15 April and 15 October of each year.
